The Village Concept

Since the early 2000s, Villages have emerged as an innovative model to help people remain in their homes and to connect with their communities throughout later life.

Villages are community-based organizations that coordinate access to a variety of supportive services to promote aging in place, social integration, health, and well-being.

Some Facts about Aging in United States

 Half of Americans 55 & older have no retirement savings and plan to live on Social Security, for which the average income is \$18,516/year

Median cost of hiring full time home care aides \$50,000/year

Median cost of semi-private room in a nursing home is \$93,000/year

Some Facts about Aging in United States, cont.

Medicare does not handle routine living assistance

Elderly homeless is the fastest rising group

• There is currently a 3-year average waiting period to receive home care services through Medicaid (to be eligible for Medicaid, an individual can have no more than \$2,000 in assets)

Chincoteague's 2021 Census Data


Taken from U.S. Census website 8/12/21. (Margin of error can be as much as 10%)

- Chincoteague population age 60 and up 39% of total population
 - Accomack County population age 60 and up = 24.6%
- Chincoteague population living at or below poverty line = 9%
 - Accomack County population living at or below poverty line = 24.6%





We create opportunities for seniors to share common interests (or spark new ones) such as game days, lunch n' learns and more


We INSPIRE

When our members need a ride to an appointment; a friendly visit; help with their iPhones, they count on Village Neighbors.


Membership Evolution ACTIVE MEMBERS EACH MONTH

Programs & Events at Island Community House


Total programs: 237
